Dear Colleagues,

I am thrilled to announce the launch of *Clinical Neurophysiology Practice (CNP)*. This Open Access journal will provide a new home for high quality manuscripts across the broad field of clinical neurophysiology, with a focus on issues of importance in clinical practice. It will thus help address the educational mission of IFCN, complementing our research-orientated journal, *Clinical Neurophysiology*, which continues under incoming Editor-in-Chief, **Professor Ulf Ziemann**.

There will be close coordination at Editorial level between these IFCN journals, and we will share the same platforms and Editorial Support Office in Amsterdam. It is likely that, with the agreement of the authors, some submissions will be transferred between the two journals, to optimize their exposure to the target audience – primarily research in clinical neurophysiology in the case of *Clinical Neurophysiology*, and primarily clinical practice in the specialty in the case of *Clinical Neurophysiology Practice*. If papers have been reviewed prior to the decision to transfer, the reviews will be made available to the relevant Editors, thus guaranteeing that the final decision on acceptability is made expeditiously.

On top of publishing ingenious discoveries and technical refinements of clinical importance, **CNP** will take advantage of its primarily online milieu by facilitating enhanced use of audiovisual technology and social media tools, thereby enriching the experience of readers, broadening the exposure of articles, and providing opportunities to better engage with our published scientists. We therefore welcome the use of videos to illustrate techniques and findings. We also encourage submissions from clinical neurophysiology technologists, especially for the new “Technical Tips” section, which will share new developments, procedures and protocols, designs, newly released devices, and “pearls” for neurophysiology practice.

Articles in the new journal will be listed initially in Scopus and ScienceDirect. Listing with PubMed Central will be sought when a sufficient number of articles has been published (and will then be backdated to include all published articles).

I invite you to submit your clinically orientated papers to **CNP** so you can share your science in a very speedy and widely visible manner. Original research papers, short communications, systematic and educational reviews, editorials, perspective pieces, unique neuroimaging photographs, clinical practice guidelines, and Letters to the Editor can be submitted via the online submission site of **CNP**. This Journal also aims to foster career development by publishing relevant papers on neurophysiology education and welcoming submissions from trainees in neurophysiology (e.g. residents, fellows, post-doctoral scholars and students). If accepted for publication, authors will be notified of the decision and asked to pay an Article Processing Fee. Following payment of this fee, the article is made universally available to all on www.sciencedirect.com and on <http://www.journals.elsevierhealth.com/>.
