Call for scientific symposia and educational teaching sessions

The ICCN 2022 program committee seeks proposals for both scientific symposia and educational teaching sessions for the International Congress of Clinical Neurophysiology, which will take place at the Palexpo convention center in **Geneva, Switzerland, September 4-8, 2022.**

Scientific symposia should focus on a scientific or clinical theme and present cutting-edge knowledge on a topic relevant to current scientific or clinical practice.

Educational teaching sessions should be based on a well-established scientific or clinical theme and provide an update on a topic relevant to current scientific or clinical practice.

Format:

- 90 minutes, minimum of 2 speakers and maximum 3 speakers (inclusive of the chairperson)
- Lecture-style format

Financial benefits are usually associated with roles such as employment, management position, independent contractor (including contracted research), consulting, speaking and teaching, membership on advisory committees or review panels, board membership, and other activities from which remuneration is received or expected. IFCN considers relationships of the person involved in the CME activity to include financial relationships of a spouse or partner.

A Commercial Interest is any proprietary entity producing health care goods or services, used on, or consumed by, patients, with the exception of non-profit or government organizations and non-health care related companies.

Relevant Financial Relationships: IFCN focuses on financial relationships with commercial interests in the 12-month period preceding the time that the individual is being asked to assume a role controlling content of the CME activity. IFCN has not set a minimal dollar amount for relationships to be significant. Inherent in any amount is the incentive to maintain or increase the value of the relationship. IFCN defines "'relevant' financial relationships" as financial relationships in any amount occurring within the past 12 months.

Conflict of Interest: Circumstances create a conflict of interest when an individual has an opportunity to affect CME content about products or services of a commercial interest with which he/she has a financial relationship.
